Those looking for a fun outing can take

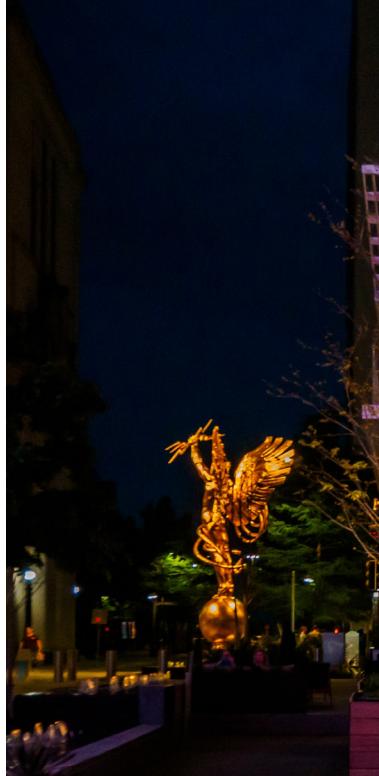
advantage of the Top Golf indoor golf simulator inside the hotel.

REUNION TOWER [3.2 MILES]

One of Dallas's most iconic landmarks, Reunion Tower's GeO-Deck rises 470 feet above the city, offering breathtaking 360-degree views of downtown Dallas and beyond. The tower is striking both by day and when it's illuminated at night, and if you look closely, you might even spot the hotel where we'll be staying! an excellent way to spend an afternoon in the city!

DEALEY PLAZA [0.9 MILES]

While in Dallas for the convention, a visit to Dealey Plaza offers a powerful glimpse into history. As the site of President John F. Kennedy's assassination, it's a place to reflect on pivotal moments that shaped our nation. As we approach our country's 250th birthday, it's a meaningful way to honor the past and those who came before us.

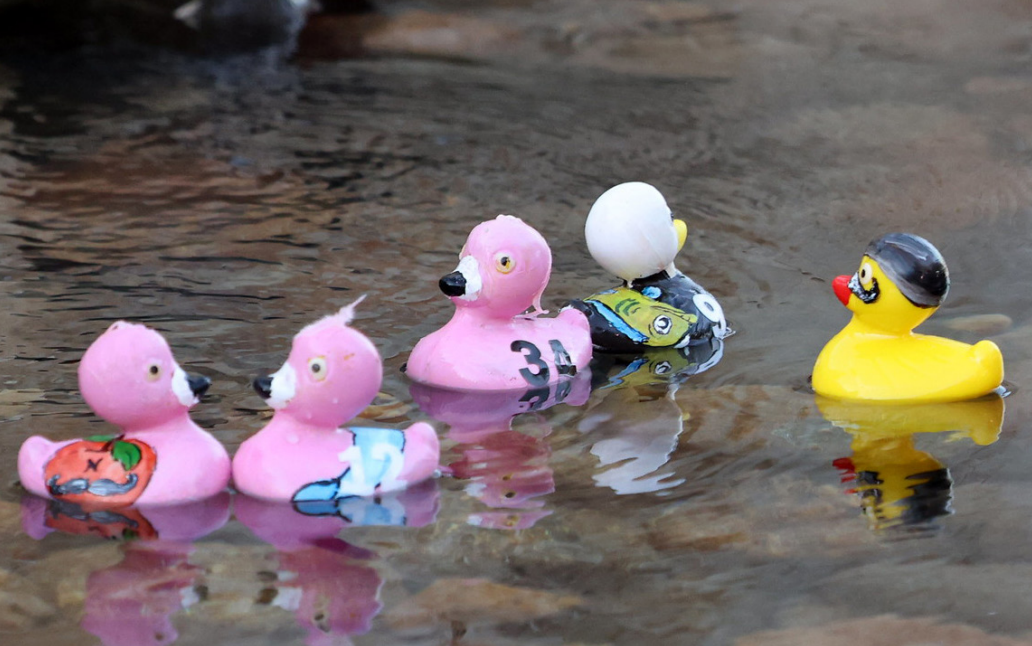

COLLABORATION IS KEY WORKING TOGETHER

Every year, the Fraternal Order of Eagles loses tens of thousands of members for the same reason - fighting within our Aeries and Auxiliaries.

Whether that fighting is between Aerie and Auxiliary members or groups within each of the sides, it is indisputable that a lack of teamwork continues to stifle our potential as a whole.

Roughly 82% of our dropped members each year mention turmoil or politics as a main contributor for why they're choosing to leave the organization.

When we let these problems linger, they have lasting effects that can lead to significant membership drops and, in some cases, permanent closure of our Aerie homes.

Fostering a positive environment that encourages collaboration and communication can be achieved in multiple ways.

Joint Meetings

Hold regular joint meetings between the Aerie and Auxiliary to encourage teamwork between the two sides and to give members an avenue to converse in a way that isn't behind-the-scenes gossip or games of telephone that lead to misinterpreted messaging.

The most successful locations we see around the country have Aeries and Auxiliaries that work together, respect each others opinions and offer clear lines of communication to cut off issues before it's too late.



MAKES A DIFFERENCE

Lead By Example

Having leaders who set the example for what is expected behaviorally makes an incredible difference in the long term viability of your Aerie/Auxiliary.

When your officers handle themselves appropriately and address problems quickly, your members are more likely to renew annually.

In most cases, members leave the organization because the turmoil is being driven by officers themselves or is allowed to persist by officers who do not appropriately discipline the individuals causing problems within the Aerie home.

Rules exist for a reason and if your local leaders don't appropriately enforce those rules, eventually the bad actors at your Aerie/Auxiliary will take advantage of that inaction to the detriment of

everyone. Similarly, if you enforce the rules as intended, your members are less likely to create issues.

Respect Each Other

Many of our Aeries and Auxiliaries have hundreds or thousands of members. Naturally, people will have differing opinions on certain matters related to operations and events.

The most important thing you can do is be civil and show respect to each other, even in the face of disagreement.

We're all fighting for the same goal and even if our desired paths to that goal may be different, we must keep our eyes on the prize and treat our fellow Eagles as what they are - our Brothers & Sisters.

DRC RESEARCHER RECEIVES

The Fraternal Order of Eagles Diabetes Research Center is proud to recognize Anna Stanhewicz, PhD for receiving the prestigious 2026 Henry Pickering Bowditch Award from the American Physiological Society.

This highly competitive national honor recognizes exceptional early career investigators who have made significant contributions to the field of physiology. As part of this distinction, Dr. Stanhewicz will be delivering a lecture at the American Physiology Summit in April 2026, where she will share insights from her innovative research program.

Dr. Stanhewicz has established herself as a rising leader in women's cardiometabolic health research. Her work centers on the

role of microvascular function – the health of the body's smallest blood vessels – and how impairments in these vessels increase the risk for heart and metabolic disease, particularly in women, especially after pregnancy.

A key focus of her research examines how gestational diabetes may set the stage for vascular changes well beyond pregnancy. By defining these long-term impacts, her findings are shaping approaches to earlier risk assessment and more prevention strategies.

In addition to her recent award, Dr. Stanhewicz was recently named Director of Research Operations in the Department of Health, Sport and Human Physiology. She will help with

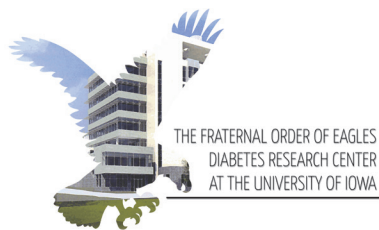

the transition of the department into the new Health Sciences Academic Building. Dr. Stanhewicz earned her Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology from the University of Rhode Island, followed by a Master of Science in Physiology and a PhD in Kinesiology from Pennsylvania State University.

She joined the University of Iowa faculty in 2019 and continues to advance impactful research that aligns closely with our Fraternal Order of Eagles Diabetes Research Center mission.

We congratulate Dr. Stanhewicz on these outstanding achievements and look forward to her continued contributions to advancing our understanding of cardiovascular and metabolic health and disease.

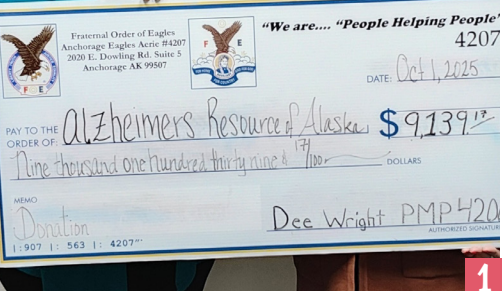

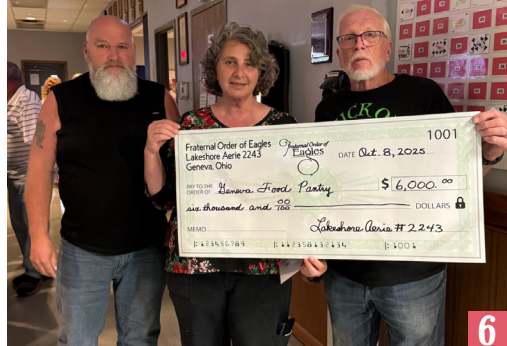

Each breast cancer diagnosis represents a life profoundly affected—a mother, a sister, a friend, and above all, a fighter. The moment of diagnosis becomes a turning point, bringing uncertainty, fear, and a wave of difficult questions about family, future plans, and personal goals.

For many, including Norma Wooster, these questions quickly become a deeply personal reality. The challenges that follow—both emotional and physical—require not only resilience, but compassionate support and clear guidance.

Corewell Health, the largest nonprofit health system in Michigan, is dedicated to providing comprehensive care to those facing breast cancer. Through its

programs, patients receive essential support, including assistance with transportation, lodging, and care navigation. Its breast cancer research initiatives have advanced early detection, improved treatment options, and expanded access to genetic testing. Grand Madam President Becky Pelkey selected the Brattleboro Retreat as her special project for 2025–2026, drawing from a personal experience that reflects the challenges many individuals face in their struggle with addiction.

Following a serious car accident during her service as a Sheriff's deputy, she was prescribed pain medication as part of her recovery. What began as a standard course of treatment gradually evolved into a far more difficult battle, as she developed a dependence on the medication.

Through perseverance and resilience, Becky Pelkey ultimately overcame her addiction and has since committed herself to supporting others navigating similar hardships.

Founded in 1834, the Brattleboro Retreat is a nonprofit mental health facility in Brattleboro, Vermont, offering comprehensive diagnostic and treatment services for individuals of all ages. The Retreat remains dedicated to providing compassionate care, support, and understanding to every individual it serves.

KEEP COMPLIANT

By Following These Simple Steps

Compliance is the key to maintaining a healthy Aerie and Auxiliary. To ensure you're in full compliance with the Grand Aerie, make sure your Aerie/Auxiliary has submitted the following to the Grand Aerie.

- Entire policy for General Liability Insurance with the Grand Aerie named as Additionally Insured.
- Bond or Employee Dishonesty coverage
- Liquor Liability Insurance
- Signed 2022 Affiliation Agreement
- 990 filed for Fraternal Year ending on May 31
- Per Capita Tax, Membership Fees, Supply Invoices and Dues Reminders Invoices paid in full to date
- Auditor & Treasurer Reports
- House Rules Submitted to the Grand Secretary's Office.
- Bylaws and house rules must be submitted to the Grand Aerie
- If their 2024-2025 990 Treasurers and Auditors report isn't in, they are out of compliance.
- The Aerie should name the Auxiliary as named insured (joint policy holder) on their policy.
- All compliance items for the Aerie or Auxiliary must be completed and submitted to the Grand Aerie no later than 45 days prior to conventions or conferences in order to be assigned a Grand Aerie representative.

STAY ACCOUNTABLE

The Grand Aerie's Member Management System (MMS) includes Compliance functionality. Ask your Local Secretary for a copy of your Club Compliance Data Sheet to see whether your Aerie or Auxiliary is in compliance or what you need to do to reach full compliance.

All members have a right to know their officers are keeping up with the duties of their positions. By holding each other accountable, we can ensure nothing slips through the cracks.



EAGLES PARTNER TO PRES

F.O.E. PLEDGES \$1.5 MILLION TO PACIFIC HISTORIC PARKS' PEARL HARBOR

The Fraternal Order of Eagles is proud to partner with Pacific Historic Parks to lead the national kickoff of the Pearl Harbor Heroes Campaign with a \$1.5 million campaign pledge.

The campaign will support critical preservation, education and endowment initiatives at Pearl Harbor, ensuring that the legacy of honor, courage and sacrifice lives on for generations to come.

"Liberty, Truth, Justice & Equality are the central tenets of the Fraternal Order of Eagles and the very tenets our brave men and women who serve fight every day to protect," said F.O.E. Grand Worthy President and Marine Veteran David Wooster. "This campaign is a natural fit for our organization and it brings us tremendous pride to know that with the help of the Eagles and our commitment

to raise \$1.5 million, we will forever preserve the sacrifices made to keep our country free."

Pacific Historic Parks will be using funds from the campaign to build a new Visitors' Center, create an endowment to fund school trips for children at no cost, create a digital archive of World War II Pacific Heroes, use immersive technology to bring historic moments and stories to life for visitors and to stabilize and restore memorials and historic structures including the USS Oklahoma and USS Utah memorials, Battleship Row Quays and Chief Petty Officer Bungalows on Ford Island.

WORK TOGETHER

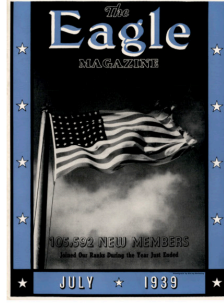
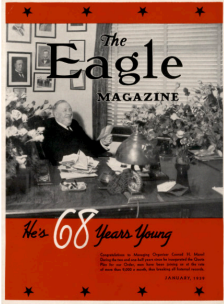

During World War II, the Fraternal Order of Eagles came together to establish the Memorial Foundation, investing \$3 million to ensure investment earnings would be able to fund the benefits to members' families.

The Foundation was created specifically to provide assistance to the children of members who lost their lives fighting overseas. In 1947, the first benefits for the Memorial Foundation were paid out and to date, more than 3,000 children have received aid totaling more than \$4 million with half of those children receiving education assistance.

In 2001, the Foundation expanded beyond just active military families, offering benefits to the families of any and all members who perish while on the job.

Educational grant recipients must furnish a yearly academic transcript, maintain a 2.0 grade-point average and be under the age of 25, unmarried and non self-supporting. Additional benefits include medical care, dental care, optical care, hospitalization and psychiatric care.

Financials A look into the 2025-2026 fiscal year

- The one-time per year Per-Capita Tax (PCT) will be calculated in May at \$20 per member. The Grand Aerie continues to operate within the budget approved by the delegation.
- Over 85% of the revenue received in the Grand Aerie comes from PCT and Membership Fees. That illustrates how important Membership is to our organization. We must continue to increase membership by making necessary investments in marketing, programs, education, and training.
